- Budget Update (Kathleen)
 - School investment "wish list" (Kevin)
 - \$1,566 total so far, approved by majority vote
 - Including soccer goals for upper and lower yards, portable sound system, balls
 - Easy-up shade structures, especially for 1st/2nd grade yard
 - Promethean alternate brand Smart Board to be brought for demo
 - Aaron can provide vendor list
 - Expenditures: \$173,568 spent of expected \$269,357
 - Budget: \$232,944 of expected \$256,250
 - Merch update (Lauren)
 - Aaron can get donated apparel from downtown
 - Idea to launch online merch store through Shopify at beginning of next school year
 - CSR (class-size reduction) Update (Kevin)
 - School attendance forecasted to be about same enrollment (235ish)
 - Intent-to-return forms have been sent out, difficult to collect data
 - Norm is 10 teachers, this spring Kevin budgeted for an 11th teacher
 - Dr. A and Ms. Chatham each going to full-time
 - Plus Julie Tobisman as coordinator
 - Kevin looking for how to fund a part-time intervention teacher within his budget, as we really need intervention instruction for those entitled to this service (also GATE)
 - Problem of whether we should pay for another CSR for one year
 - We do not know how these teachers will be distributed
 - Will TK be larger because of new early childhood legislation?
 - Option to pay for a full time music teacher
 - district funds 1 day/week could we move to 2 days/week
 - Rate sheet provided, preliminary sign-up for instrumental
 - Ceiri to ask Miss Bailey

- What can be done to communicate to parents about problems that will be addressed for next year
 - To avoid drop-outs, parents should be informed of intent to provide intervention teacher, and avoid teacher and grade splits
 - A lot of families will be withdrawing due to problems faced this year, we need to communicate that things will be different
 - Kathleen will follow up about a zoom meeting to be scheduled to discuss this with parents

 - Woodstock theme band Kummerspeck, dj, sunset cocktails, hors d'oeuvres by non-profit culinary program for homeless teens
 - only 22 tickets sold because no promotion yet (until after Variety Show – should plug at Variety Show)
 - flyers posted at Pine Tree, general public welcome to attend
 - Forecasted budget of around \$12,000

- Science Day, April 21
 - Additional \$2,000 grant from Department of Water and Power
 - Hartstreet (a title 1 school) 5th grade coming (123 students)
 - what to give them all water bottles/flashlights and veggie pops

- Program includes morphology discussion, Raptor day presentation, RCD dissection
- YMCA coaches asked to supervise during lunch
 - A lot of volunteers needed, especially for lunch period
