

TEP giving fund \$168k in budget, \$117,736 expected based on recurring, so \$50,264 still needed. We are at 70%

Halloween carnival brought in \$16,275 and cost \$5,096 for a profit of \$11,179. Budget estimated \$18.5k but also budgeted for \$9k of expenses for a profit of \$9.5k so actually ended up about \$1,680+

Coyote Run brought in \$20,461. Budget estimated \$13.5k so about \$7k+

Variety Show brought in \$5,617 and cost about \$500 for a \$5k profit. Budget estimated \$3k so about \$2k+

Overall fundraising is up about \$10k over budget!!
